Revelation 12:7-9

7 And war broke out in heaven: Michael and his angels fought with the dragon; and the dragon and his angels fought,

8 but they did not prevail, nor was a place found for them in heaven any longer.

9 So the great dragon was cast out, that serpent of old, called the Devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was cast to the earth, and his angels were cast out with him.

What do you typically do when you feel afraid?

Mark 9:17-22a

17 Then one of the crowd answered and said, "Teacher, I brought You my son, who has a mute spirit.

18 "And wherever it seizes him, it throws him down; he foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth, and becomes rigid. So I spoke to Your disciples, that they should cast it out, but they could not."

19 He answered him and said, "O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him to Me."

20 Then they brought him to Him. And when he saw Him, immediately the spirit convulsed him, and he fell on the ground and wallowed, foaming at the mouth.

21 So He asked his father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood.

22 "And often he has thrown him both into the fire and into the water to destroy him.

What steps can you take to ground yourself in Christ as preparation for the enemy's attacks?

- **Pray Often.** Ask God to increase and strengthen your faith. Make it a habit of asking God to strengthen your faith and guide you into a deeper truth in Him.
- Pray Daily. Stop relying on yourself as you face difficulties and spiritual attacks. Express your total dependence on God through prayer at the beginning of each day.
- Pray Constantly. Invite the presence of Jesus into every situation. Form the discipline of continually conversing with God's Spirit as you encounter new situations and circumstances throughout each day.

As disciples of Jesus, we don't need to look for a "demon under every bush" but neither should we be unaware or unprepared. Use prayer to keep yourself intimately connected with God's power through Jesus Christ.



Lesson 3: The Paranormal (Deuteronomy 18:9-18)

 What movies or TV shows bank on our culture's interest in the paranormal?

Deuteronomy 18:9-11

9 "When you come into the land which the LORD your God is giving you, you shall not learn to follow the abominations of those nations.

10 "There shall not be found among you anyone who makes his son or his daughter pass through the fire, or one who practices witchcraft, or a soothsayer, or one who interprets omens, or a sorcerer,

11 "or one who conjures spells, or a medium, or a spiritist, or one who calls up the dead.

- **Child Sacrifice.** Children were killed to appease a pagan god and influence events that god supposedly controlled.
- **Divination.** This was a general term for trying to gain insights from the gods through various means, including other practices listed in this passage.
- Fortune Telling. Means "those who cause to appear." It
 might have referred to making apparitions appear or
 making a persons' course of action visible through
 occultic practices.
- **Interpreting Omens.** Those who practice this sought to determine the future through the use of objects.
- **Sorcery.** Witches and sorcerers attempted to manipulate the powers of nature.
- Casting Spells. The Hebrew term has the sense of binding or fascinating; it meant to bind a person with a curse.

- **Be Blameless.** Seek to demonstrate a blameless heart, fully devoted to the Lord, by removing from your presence anything that promotes and encourages the use of paranormal practices.

Lesson 4: Fear Not (1 John 4:1-6)

 What are some of the most unusual phobias you've heard of?

1 John 4:1-3

1 Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world.

2 By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God,

3 and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.

When you test the validity of a group, consider these examples:

- Mormonism teaches that Jesus was the first Spirit child born to humanity's heavenly parents.
- Jehovah's Witnesses teach that Jesus was a sprit creature created by God who later. Amen to earth as a man.
- Islam teaches that Jesus was a highly revered prophet, but He was not the Son of God.
- Hinduism teaches that Jesus was a man who reached "God Consciousness."

How will the truth that you have nothing to fear in Christ make a difference in your life this week?

- Memorize. If you're prone to fear, memorize 1 John 4:4.
- Be Filled. God has placed His Holy Spirit in your life. Stay focused in Prayer so you can continually rely on that Spirit to fill you, and give you discernment.
- Be Discerning. Regularly evaluate the different "voices" you encounter in books, sermons, studies, online devotions, and articles. Determine what they believe about Christ and to what degree they lift up and honor the name of Christ.

Severe phobias aren't the only factor that keeps us from experiencing the life we were meant to live. Yes, evil is real. But so is God and he is far superior to any force or opposition that might move against us. So don't be afraid.

What are some "tools of the trade" you rely on most days?

Ephesians 6:10-13

10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.

13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

God provides His armor for the battles we face in His name:

- Belt Of Truth. The belt secured the rest of the soldier's armor and held his weapons. Truth is the belt of preparation for the believer. Everything we do is held I. Place when we accept and trust God's Word.
- Breastplate Of Righteousness. A soldier's breastplate covered the chest and protected the vital organs from arrows. Paul wasn't referring to our righteousness in Christ, which can never be taken away. Instead, he was referring to Living in Righteousness (Eph. 4:24; 5:8-9) our daily walk with Christ.
- Feet Shod With Readiness. Roman soldiers were issued quality footwear, studded boots that allowed them to travel great distances and yet stand firm in the heat of battle.
- **Shield Of Faith.** A company of soldiers could interlock their shields and form a solid wall as they moved forward. Our shield is comprised of our faith, our trust in the promises and power of God.
- Helmet Of Salvation. A soldier protected his head with a heavy helmet of metal. Our helmet is our hope in Christ.
- Sword Of The Spirit. The soldier's sword was short, like a dagger, and used for close combat. Our sword is God's Word; it's our only weapon that is both offensive and defensive.

- **Pray.** Take everything to God in Prayer. Make Prayer a regular part of your day.
- **Stand.** If you find you're susceptible to the flaming arrows if the evil one, his lies, doubts, and temptations use God's armor.
- **Stand together.** Discuss ways to support and encourage each other in the spiritual battles we face.

Don't lose sight of the fact you're in a spiritual battle that doesn't include just you. You have help! You have the support of your friends and family. More importantly, you have the support of God, who empowers you to stand.

 Look to Jesus. Be intentional about keeping your focus on Christ. Lean on Him for strength to stand, knowing He understands. "For since He himself has suffered when He was tempted, He is able to help those who are tempted" (Heb. 2:18)



- **Stay clear.** If you know of people, places, or circumstances that fuel your vulnerability to temptation and spiritual attack, resolve to avoid those things.
- Memorize scripture. Make scripture memory a weekly discipline and habit.

Expect opposition when you step forward in faith. Spiritual attacks will come. But we can follow Jesus' example to stand against those attacks and remain victorious.
