

Experience New Life in Christ Lesson Three: A LOVE YOU CAN EXPERIENCE

Scriptures: Romans 5:6-11, 18-21

Question: What do you mean when you say, "I love you"?		
Words to remember:		
Just: Righteous, observing Divine laws.		
Good: Upright, honorable, distinguished		
Love: Agape, love in spite of and not because of		
Reconciliation: atonement, returned to favor		
Scripture Text:		
Romans 5:6-11 (NIV)		
6 You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. 7 Very rarely will any die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. 8 But God demonstrate his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.		
John 15:13, 1 John 4:7-11		

Romans 5:9-11

9 Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! (Ephesians 2:11-13) 10 For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! (2 Corinthians 5:17-20)



11 Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.		
18 Consequently, just as one trespass resulted in condemnation for all people, so also one righteous act resulted in justification and life for all people. Genesis 3		
19 For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.		
20 The law was brought in so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more,		
21 so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
